JOHN KAMEVAAR - CURRICULUM VITAE

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CCMC

From 1981-94, performed and recorded with the improvisation ensemble CCMC. Spontaneous compositions without reference to any predetermined form; from a free-jazz platform, moved out to encompass a broad range of idioms. Personnel was at various times comprised of Al Mattes, Casey Sokol, Nobuo Kubota, Jack Vorvis, Paul Dutton, and Michael Snow.

Performed weekly at the Music Gallery in Toronto and toured internationally, including:

- 1982-a 3 week residency at the Festival of Avignon
- 1983-a 6 week tour of Germany and Austria: "O Kanada" festival in Berlin, concerts in Cologne, Stuttgart, Innsbruk, Gmunden and Graz
- 1984- Olympic Arts Festival in Los Angeles, and concerts in Vancouver, Victoria and Regina
- 1985- a 2 week residency "Holland Festival", Amsterdam
- 1986- a week of concerts at the Canadian Pavilion, Expo 86, Vancouver
- 1988- 3 week tour of Japan: Tokyo, Kyoto, Hammamatsu-city, and Osaka.

Rejoined CCMC 2012-2022 with Paul Dutton, Michael Snow and John Oswald.

KAISER NIETZSCHE

In 1986 began doing tape compositions, which moved towards feedback, electronics and signal processing. Called one of the pieces *Kaiser Nietzsche* (the philosopher's signature in a letter to Strindberg). The name became the title of a first album, on cassette. This developed into the group Kaiser Nietzsche with Thomas Handy and David Scurr. They played concerts and issued several releases, many on the Freedom In A Vacuum label.

Played at the Canadian Electro-acoustic Community's "Perspective" series at Concordia University in 1991, where Handy and Kamevaar performed "Send", a work for 2 microphone feedback fields.

The 1997 re-release of the split CD *Yuzuru Syogase / Kaiser Nietzsche* by Artware Production (first released by Freedom in a Vacuum in 1994) was applauded by noise music followers as an essentail in the genre.

In 1990 Kaiser Nietzsche produced soundtracks for two Toronto experimental filmmakers: Mike Hoolboom's *southern pine inspection bureau no. 9* and Carl Brown's *Re:Entry*.

Multimedia artist Zev Farber was a member of Kaiser Nietzsche from 2009-11, and they created a suite of video/audio works.
